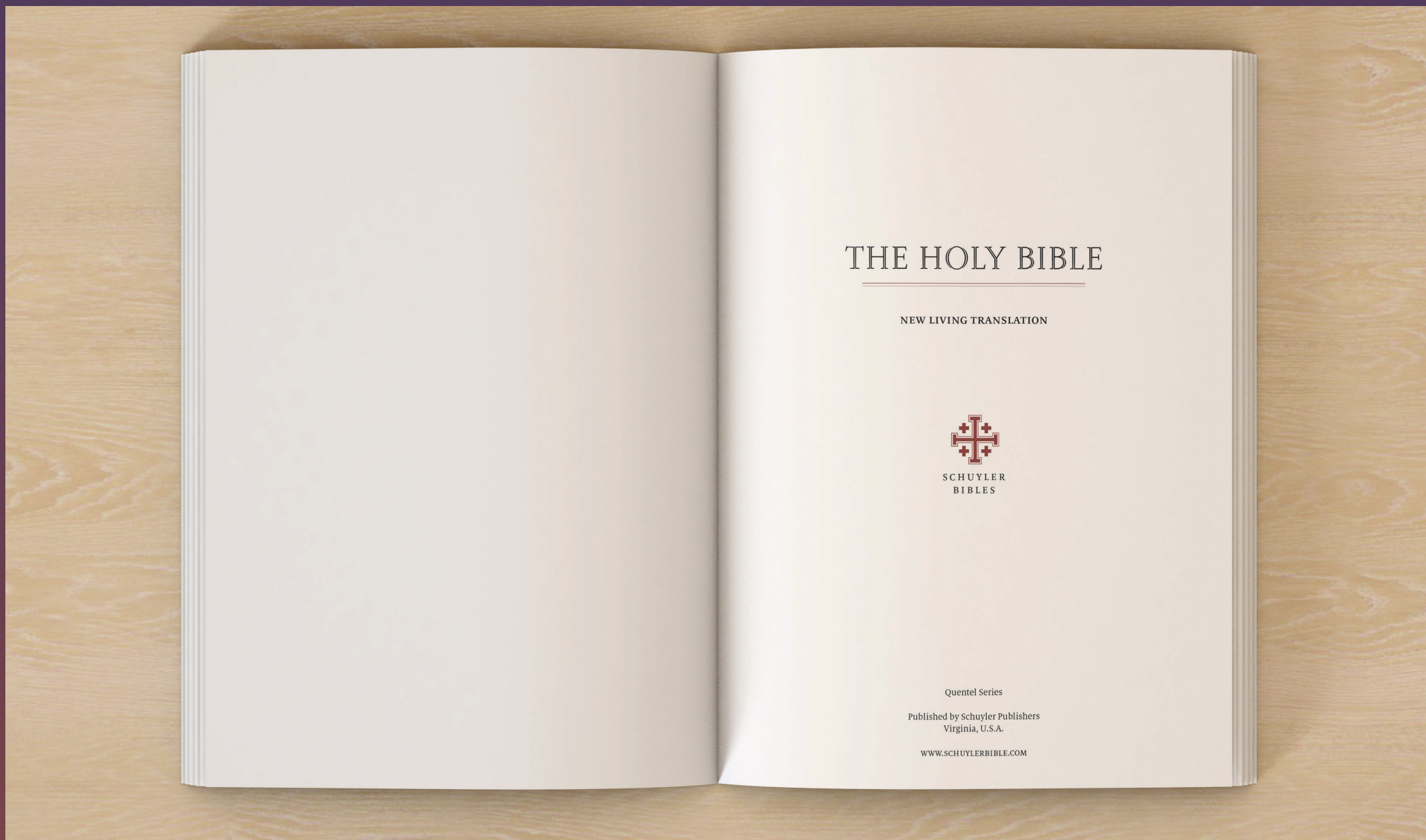

#### CAIN AND ABEL

**N**ow Adam\* had sexual relations with  
his wife, Eve, and she became preg-  
nant. When she gave birth to Cain,  
she said, "With the LORD's help, I have pro-  
duced\* a man!"<sup>2</sup> Later she gave birth to his  
brother and named him Abel.

When they grew up, Abel became a shep-  
herd, while Cain cultivated the ground.  
<sup>3</sup> When it was time for the harvest, Cain pre-  
sented some of his crops as a gift to the LORD.  
<sup>4</sup> Abel also brought a gift—the best portions  
of the firstborn lambs from his flock. The  
LORD accepted Abel and his gift,<sup>5</sup> but he did  
not accept Cain and his gift. This made Cain  
very angry, and he looked dejected.

<sup>6</sup> "Why are you so angry?" the LORD asked  
Cain. "Why do you look so dejected? You will  
be accepted if you do what is right. But if you  
refuse to do what is right, then watch out! Sin  
is crouching at the door, eager to control you.  
But you must subdue it and be its master."

<sup>8</sup> One day Cain suggested to his brother,  
"Let's go out into the fields."\* And while they  
were in the field, Cain attacked his brother,  
Abel, and killed him.

<sup>9</sup> Afterward the LORD asked Cain, "Where  
is your brother? Where is Abel?"

"I don't know," Cain responded. "Am I my  
brother's guardian?"

<sup>10</sup> But the LORD said, "What have you  
done? Listen! Your brother's blood cries  
out to me from the ground!<sup>11</sup> Now you are  
cursed and banished from the ground,

<sup>12</sup> No longer will the ground yield good  
crops for you, no matter how hard you  
work! From now on you will be a home-

<sup>17</sup> Cain had sexual relations with his wife,

Enoch. Then Cain founded a city, which he  
named Enoch, after his son.<sup>18</sup> Enoch had a  
son named Irad. Irad became the father of\*  
Mehujael. Methujael became the father of  
Methushael. Methushael became the fa-  
ther of Lamech.

<sup>19</sup> Lamech married two women. The first  
was named Adah, and the second was Zil-  
lah.<sup>20</sup> Adah gave birth to Jabal, who was the  
first of those who raise livestock and live  
in tents.<sup>21</sup> His brother's name was Jubal,  
the first of all who play the harp and flute.  
<sup>22</sup> Lamech's other wife, Zillah, gave birth to  
a son named Tubal-cain. He became an ex-  
pert in forging tools of bronze and iron.  
Tubal-cain had a sister named Naamah.

"Adah and Zillah, hear my voice;

#### THE DESCENDANTS OF ADAM

**T**his is the written account of the  
descendants of Adam. When God  
created human beings,\* he made  
them to be like himself.<sup>2</sup> He created them  
male and female, and he blessed them and  
called them "human."

<sup>3</sup> When Adam was 130 years old, he  
became the father of a son who was  
just like him—in his very image. He  
named his son Seth.<sup>4</sup> After the birth of  
Seth, Adam lived another 800 years,  
and he had other sons and daughters.  
<sup>5</sup> Adam lived 930 years, and then he  
died.

<sup>6</sup> When Seth was 105 years old, he became  
the father of\* Enosh.<sup>7</sup> After the birth  
of\* Enosh, Seth lived another 807 years,  
and he had other sons and daughters.  
<sup>8</sup> Seth lived 912 years, and then he died.
